Overall there was great participation and enthusiasm during the MCO's. Below are some quick notes that lead to successful incidents.

<u>Initial Radio Report (IRR)</u> - First in Company Officer "paints the picture" - Hail Dispatch, Number of Stories, Structure Type, Water Supply, Command, 360

Follow Up Report (FUR) – Confirms your Incident Action Plan (IAP) - Hail Dispatch or Command, 360 Complete, Life Safety, Hazards, Confirm Fire Location, Mode, Exclusion Zones if present



<u>2 in 2 Out</u> – Are you in Rescue Mode? If not, do you have a Stand-by Team or RIC?

<u>Transfer of Command</u> – If the 2nd in Officer assumes command, do they have a clear picture of units and assignments? Did Tasks, Location and Objectives (TLO's) get communicated over the radio?



<u>2nd in Officer Assumes Command</u> – Location, Mode, Control Zones, 2nd Alarm, if so, where?

<u>Tactical Benchmarks!!! Tactical Benchmarks!!! Tactical</u> Benchmarks!!!

These practiced behaviors accomplish standard interoperability among our agencies, while insuring we meet legal and industry standards, which directly improves firefighter safety.



CONFINED SPACE RESCUE REFRESHER

Lt. Merrick with Shoreline was the lead for the Confined Space Rescue refresher training at Point Wells (Aug. 31st, Sept. 1st -3rd). The drill involved Bothell, Northshore, Woodinville and Shoreline Fire Departments The drill was a simulated rescue of a worker inside a large tank. The rescuers had to enter through a 20" hole on top of the tank and be lowered some 45' to the victim. The rescuers were wearing self-contained breathing units while rescuing the patient. The rest of the rescue team was on top of the tank operating a raising and lowering systems. The drill was part of the required annual training for TRT in Confined Space Rescue.

Update

Coming soon from the King County Fire Chiefs Association, revisions to the King County Model Procedures.

On December 15, 2019 King County Fire Chiefs Executive Committee asked the King County Fire Chiefs Operations Group to review all King County Fire Chiefs Model Procedures, including the Purpose Statement. The KC Executive Team agreed that the intent of the Model Procedures should support the King County Automatic Aid ILA. The goal is for the procedures to be used as department SOGs/SOPs where applicable, instead of having different SOGs/SOPs that may conflict. The effort is to move towards the County acting as one department.

Over the past year the Committee reviewed all King County Model Procedures and had representatives from Zone 1, 3 and 5 as well as representatives from Valley Communications, NORCOM 911, SKCFTC and NKCTC. These changes will be presented to the Chiefs in October with a request to adopt by the OPS Chiefs. Plan on information coming out in the next couple of months highlighting those revisions and how training and fire ground operations may be affected.
