CBTT TRAINING

Command Based Tactical Training was taught to BC's and Act BC's. The class focused on communications, Tactical worksheet and transfer of command.



Company Based Tactical Training is currently being presented to LT's and Act. LT's focused on communications, initial units best practices, leaning forward and transfer of command.

PUMP ACADEMY COORDINATOR: CAPTAIN EASON

Efforts to coordinate a NKCTC Pump Academy are under way. Work to date includes:

 Instructors from each agency have been identified.



- We currently have 19 students reserved
- With support from the Ops Chiefs, we will be developing a NKCTC Pump Operators Task Book.

INCIDENT SAFETY OFFICER CERTIFICATION COORDINATOR: BC VANDERTOORN

The Consortium has begun work on an ISO Certification Program.

- Each agency will become a member of the Fire Department Safety Officers Association.
- Roughly 36 students will be participating in the certification process
- Coordinate the assignments and testing for each student in order to become Pro-Board Certified.
